

Law Letter of Recommendation

It is my great pleasure to recommend XXX for the J.D. program at Columbia Law School. I was XXX professor in a class at Columbia Law School. I was impressed by Ethan's academic performance and by his potential to be a great lawyer. I believe he would be a unique addition both to our J.D. student body and to our university community.

I am the former chairman of Milbank, Tweed, Hadley & McCloy. I received my J.D. and M.B.A. degrees from Columbia University.
